## Editors

Distinguished Visiting Professor **Farhad Malekian** is the founder and director of the Institute of International Criminal Law, Uppsala, Sweden. He was one of the leading academics in The World Conference on the Establishment of an International Criminal Court to Enforce International Criminal Law and Human Rights, Associated with the United Nations, International Institute of Higher Studies in Criminal Sciences, Syracuse, Italy (1992 and 1995). Malekian was nominated in Who is Who in 1996. He was listed among the “distinguished leaders in the field” of international criminal law in the twentieth century by L’Association Internationale de Droit Pénal. In 2005, he introduced the Principle of International Tribunality of Jurisdiction at the Cornell Law School. Malekian’s views are analysed internationally and within doctoral dissertations. He is the author of outstanding “selected major treatises” as well as a considerable number of books and articles which have been an integral part of reading literature in different universities such as Europa-universität Viadrina in Frankfurt, Germany; Faculty of Law, University of New South Wales, Sydney, Australia; School of International Studies, University of Trento, Italy; Institute of Hartford Seminary, United States; Mid Sweden University and Stockholm University, Sweden; International Summer University Ohrid, Macedonia; Faculty of Law, University of Canterbury, New Zealand; Kent Law School, University of Kent, Canterbury, United Kingdom.

Malekian’s works are referred to in many languages e.g. English, Arabic, Chinese, Finish, Danish, Serbian, Russian, German, Norwegian, Latvian, French, Swedish, Turkish and Spanish. To mention just a few, his works include International Criminal Law: The Legal and Critical Analysis of International Crimes (2 volumes, 1991); The Monopolization of International Criminal Law in the United Nations, A Jurisprudential Approach (2<sup>nd</sup> ed., 1995); Documents on the Principles of International Human Rights (2007); Emasculating the Philosophy of International Criminal Justice in the Iraqi Special Tribunal, Cornell International Law Journal (2005); The Homogeneity of International Criminal Court with the

Islamic Jurisprudence, *International Criminal Law Review* (2009); *Principles of Islamic International Criminal Law, A Comparative Search* (2<sup>nd</sup> ed., 2011), *Principles of International Criminal Justice* (forthcoming 2011), and invitation to contribute two articles to the most comprehensive reference work -*Encyclopaedia of Criminology & Criminal Justice* - to be published by Wiley-Blackwell (5 volumes 2012). Professor and Dr of Laws **Kerstin Nordlöf** joined the Örebro University Department of Law in December 2008. In addition to her responsibilities as a professor of law and teaching Penal Law, Criminal Procedural Law, Social Law, International Law, European Union Law, she also lectures on Juvenile Criminal Law. Her basic research interests include Penal Law, Criminal Procedural Law and Evidence, International Law and Social law, with a particular focus on children’s rights before the criminal justice system. She is also engaged in questions of trafficking in women and children. Nordlöf also has a particular research interest in the implementation of the rights of children at an international level.

Before joining the Örebro University in Sweden, Nordlöf was an adjunct judge in the Court of Appeal in Stockholm in 2007-2008. For several years she was associate professor of law in Mid Sweden University and head of the Department of Law at the same university. She was also a visiting professor of law in 2005. Nordlöf has also taught for several years in Stockholm where she obtained her degree Doctor of Laws. She has written extensively in the fields of criminal procedure law and criminal law, and delivered international lectures. Some of her articles deal with *The Legal Philosophy of Protecting a Suspect Child* (2006), *International Principles and Rights of Children in Criminal Cases* (2007), and *Economic Raison d’être of Trafficking in Children* (2012). Her forthcoming books are the *Prohibition of Sex Trafficking Constituting Obligatio Erga Omnes, the International Rules of Law for the Protection of Children: Analysis and Documents* (2012) as well as in Swedish the *Criminal Law Procedure for Juveniles* (2012).
